

HISTORY OF MUNICIPAL INCOME TAX IN TROTWOOD

The City of Trotwood has had a municipal income tax since 1968, when Income Tax Ordinance 13-68 was passed (and has subsequently been amended). This tax was imposed to provide revenue in support of municipal operations.

The current tax rate of 2.25% was passed by voters and made effective 7/1/1993.

On January 1, 1996, the residents of the former Madison Township became residents of the City of Trotwood due to a merger of both entities.

The City of Dayton was the administrative agency contracted to collect the municipal income tax for the City of Trotwood. In October of 2002, the City of Trotwood began independent tax collection with the creation of the Income Tax Support Services Division. The addition of this division will make the process of filing returns and making payments much easier for the residents of Trotwood, as the office is centrally located within our community.
